 - 2013 nominee Toan Do selected as national honoree
 - 2014 nominee to be determined by the region's Regional Scholar selection committee (Ann Fritschel, Troy Martin, Clare Rothschild, Eric F. Mason; regional award is \$400)—[James W. Barker, visiting assistant professor at Luther College, Iowa, was selected for the award after the conclusion of the meeting]
- 9. Date and location for 2015 meeting and future plans—we will return to Olivet Nazarene University for the 2015 (Feb. 6-8) and 2016 (dates TBD) meetings; we will continue to explore sites for the 2017 meeting that coincides with the AOS (Middle-West Branch) centennial
